The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same, containing a description in the words of the same Ansel Hayward himself of the improvement in the construction of an Ink standish or case for pen and ink.

This invention consists of lining the standish with glass. The standish is made of stone or iron taken ??? ??? blast or air furnace, and moulded in same, a certain degree of heat is infused into the standish and melted glass taken from the pot with a common blow pipe, is blown into the standish which completely lines the inside of thereof, copper pins are placed in the holes, designed for the pens when out of use, previous to blowing in the glass which being drawn out leaves cases for the pens separate from the ink.
